Lilly Ledbetter
Speaker and Awardee

Lilly Ledbetter has become a symbol of the struggle for equal pay for working Americans. Lilly was the plaintiff in the U.S. Supreme Court case *Ledbetter v. Goodyear Tire & Rubber*, which severely limited the ability of victims of pay discrimination to sue under Title VII of the Civil Rights Act of 1964. The Supreme Court said that Ledbetter had filed her discrimination complaint too late, and calculated the law's 180-day deadline to sue from the day Ledbetter received her last discriminatory raise, rather than—as done in previous years—from the day she received her last discriminatory paycheck. As a champion of the Ledbetter Fair Pay Act, H.R. 2831/S. 1843, Lilly will not receive any of its benefits but will know that, with its passage, others will avoid the economic hardships she faced without fair pay and retirement benefits.
