Step	Define Identify Analyze	Notes
Step 1 <ul style="list-style-type: none">• Define the major issue or goal.• Describe clearly and concisely the issue that will be addressed		
Step 2 <ul style="list-style-type: none">• Define the competing agendas.• State clearly what the union is trying to accomplish.		
Step 3 <ul style="list-style-type: none">• Identify the major decision makers.• Determine what individuals or groups have the power to actually make the decisions on this issue.

<p>Step 4</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Identify the organized opposition. • Determine what individuals or groups are organized to fight against us on this issue. 		
<p>Step 5</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Identify the organized allies. • List individuals and groups that support our agenda and are organized to fight with us. 		
<p>Step 6</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Identify key un-organized constituencies. • List groups of people who are affected by this issue but are not represented by an organization. 		
<p>Step 7</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Analyze the map and develop strategies for changing the power equation.
