We are excited to welcome you to Boston for the 87th convention of the American Federation of Teachers!

The materials in this packet are intended to make your experience as a convention delegate as easy as possible. On the following pages, you will find details on the following:

- **COVID-19 safety protocols**—Your safety is our highest priority. Be sure to familiarize yourself with these so that you know what to expect. Before traveling to Boston, you should download and register with the CLEAR app (*see below*) and upload proof of full vaccination.
- Tickets for AFT-sponsored breakfast and lunch events—Don't delay! The deadline for ticket sales is Friday, July 1, and tickets will not be sold in Boston.

### **SO LONG, PINK CREDENTIAL CARDS!**

Yet another way the AFT convention is "going green."

Veteran delegates may recall receiving pink credential cards in the mail to present at registration. Starting this year, just present the QR code in your confirmation email at registration. It can be scanned on your mobile device or from a paper printout. That QR code is unique to you, so don't share it with others!

Those who arrive at registration without it will be asked to present photo ID to register.

# **COVID-19 SAFETY**

The AFT has a responsibility to provide a safe meeting environment free of known hazards. We believe our collective responsibility to each person's health and safety is best served by ensuring that everyone who attends the AFT convention is fully vaccinated against COVID-19. This has been the AFT's practice throughout the pandemic.

The following protocols are required of all attendees at official convention sessions and AFT-sponsored events:

- **1. Proof of full vaccination**—Upload your vaccination card via the CLEAR app (*see next page*). Full vaccination means completion of the primary series of Pfizer, Moderna or J&J shots. The AFT encourages attendees to be up to date with all boosters recommended for you.
- **2. Negative antigen test on July 13 or 14**—On July 13 or 14, allow 30 minutes upon arrival at the convention center to take a rapid antigen test administered by Impact Health. You will upload your results to the CLEAR app.
- **3. Second negative antigen test on July 16**—When you register, you will receive an additional test kit to take back to your hotel. On Saturday, July 16, utilizing this test kit, you will be required to upload a second negative test result to the CLEAR app.
- **4. Mask requirement**—A mask that covers your nose and mouth must be worn in the convention center unless you are actively eating or drinking.
- **5. Daily health check**—Complete the daily health survey via the CLEAR Health Pass. You will be required to show the green status screen on your app each day for admission to the AFT convention events.

- **Privacy and CLEAR**—Your personal information will remain private between you and CLEAR. The AFT will only receive confirmation that an attendee has satisfied the requirements for access with a green result. The AFT does not have access to any private health data.



# **Transportation Information**

### **WHEN YOU ARRIVE**

It is an eight-minute **taxi ride** from Boston Logan Airport to the Boston Convention and Exhibition Center and the AFT convention hotels. There is a \$3.25 Airport Fee added to all fares to and from Logan. Taxis are available at each terminal on the Arrivals level, except Terminal C where they are located on the Ground level of the Central Parking Garage.

You can also "take the T" to and from the airport for only \$2.75 per trip. Take the Silver Line just two stops from the airport to the BCEC. Visit www.mbta.com/ for details.

**Important Note:** The Sumner Tunnel, one of two tunnels between Logan Airport and downtown Boston, is currently closed weekends for extensive MassDOT restoration work. Please be aware of this if you are going to or from Logan between Friday, July 15, at 11:00 p.m. and Monday, July 18, at 5:00 a.m. Consider taking the MBTA.
