WHAT CALIFORNIA STUDENTS NEED TO KNOW ABOUT CORINTHIAN'S CLOSURE

Important information for students who recently attended Heald College, Everest College or WyoTech:

- You are likely eligible to have your **federal student loans cancelled**.
- You may be eligible for **reimbursement for some private loans** through California's Student Tuition Recovery Fund.
- You can access free legal advice to help you through the loan discharge process.
- Note that *transferring any credits to another institution may make you lose your right to a refund*.
- Don't rush your decisions about next steps.

The California attorney general has set up a website with an interactive tool to help you get the applications you need for loan cancellation and to connect you with free legal advice. Visit https://oag.ca.gov/corinthian.

NEXT STEPS

Do **not rush into any decisions** about next steps. You do not lose any benefits by taking the time you need to make the right decision, but *you may lose benefits by rushing to make a decision*.

Here are some things to consider about transferring to another school:

- Be wary of any special "limited time" deals or temporary scholarships that are designed to force a quick decision.
- Some of the other colleges recruiting you or being suggested to you as transfer options are **under** federal and/or state investigation for deception.

If you're unsure of your federal loan debt you can look it up online at https://www.nslds.ed.gov/ (PIN needed) to find out what you owe and find contact information for your loan servicer.
