

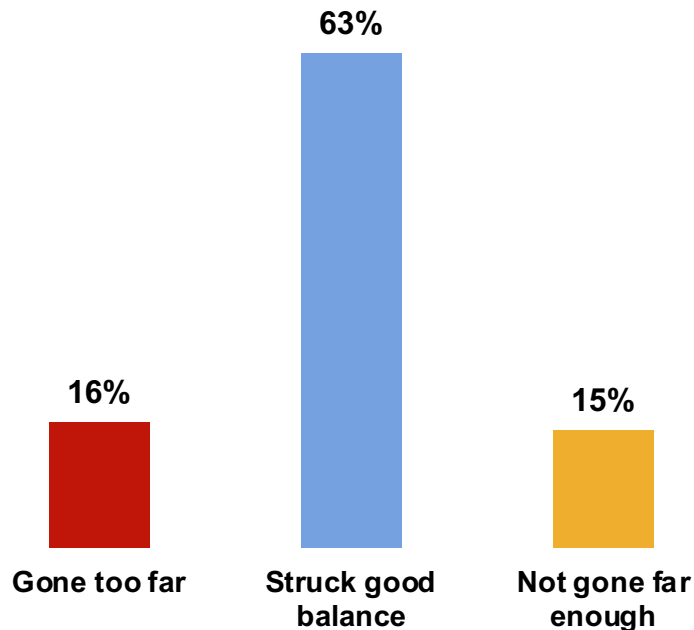

# Districts Have Struck Right Balance on In-Person Instruction

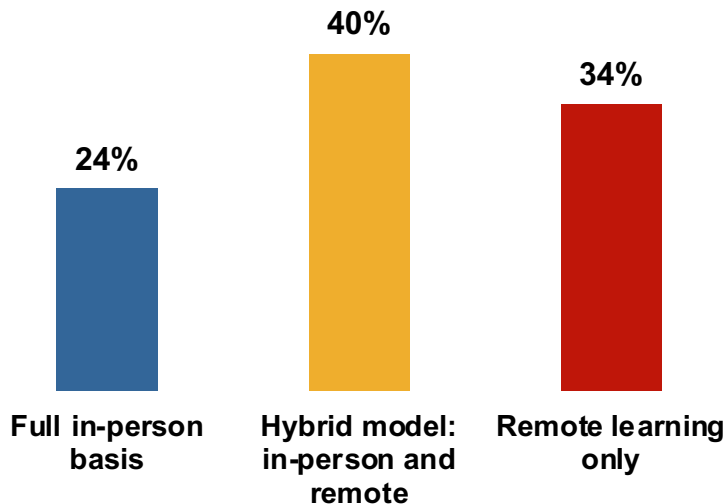
*Assessment of My School System's Current Level of In-Person Instruction*

Good balance	65%	65%	55%

Remote only	15%	24%	75%

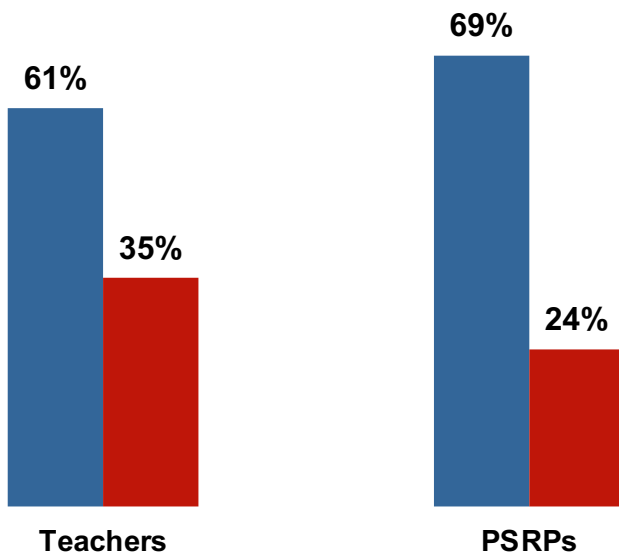
# Most with In-Person Experience Are Comfortable, But Those at Home Remain Concerned

*Have you felt comfortable returning to work in-person so far?*

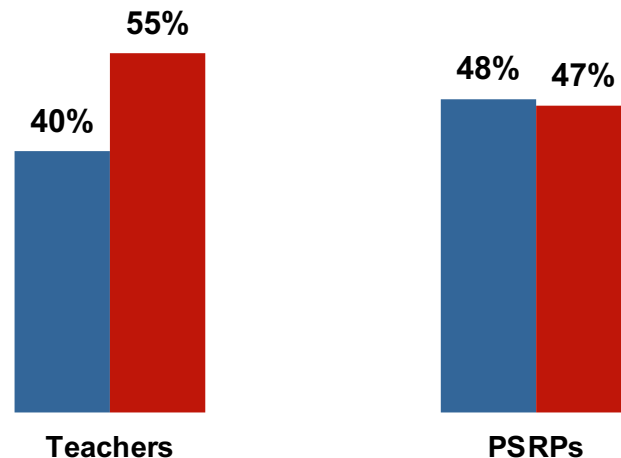
*Would you feel comfortable returning to work in-person?*

■ Have NOT felt/would NOT feel comfortable



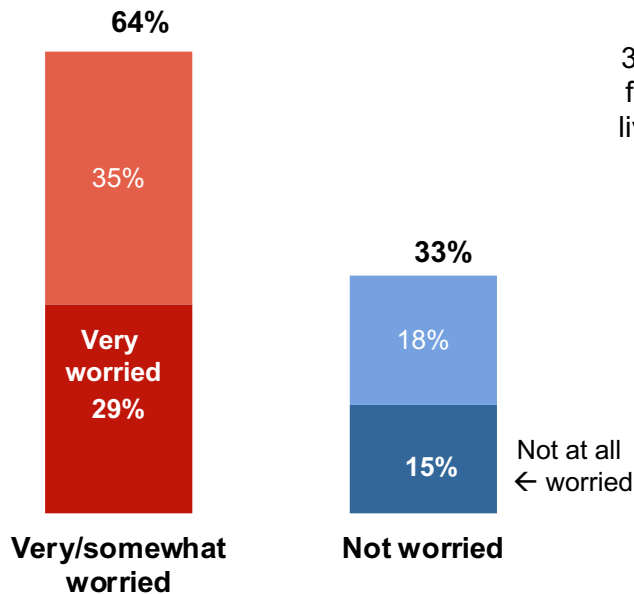
**SCHOOL OPERATING IN-PERSON OR HYBRID MODE**



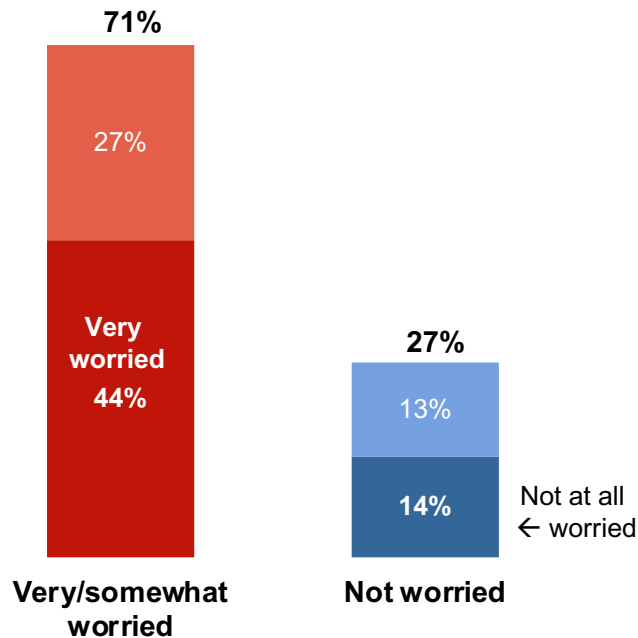
**SCHOOL OPERATING IN REMOTE-ONLY MODE**

*How worried are you that you might get infected with COVID-19 at work?*



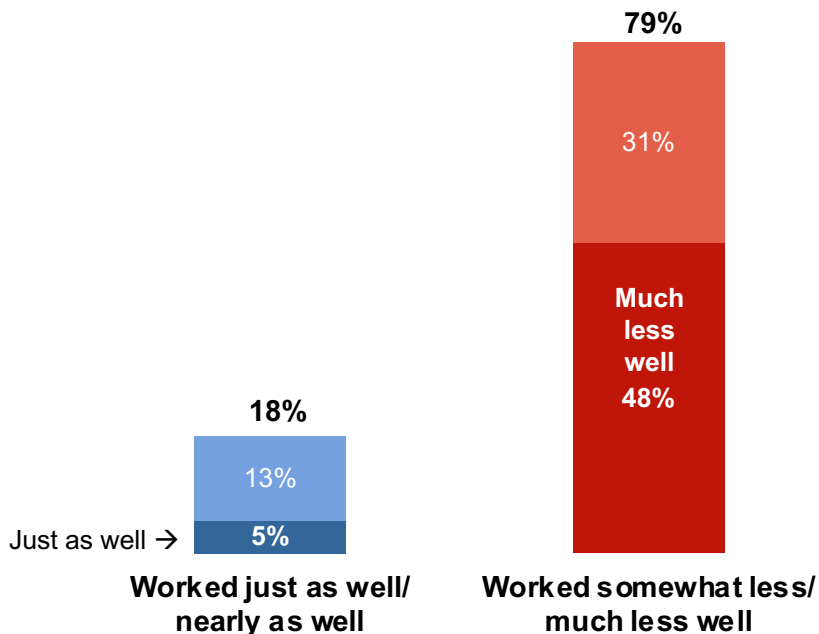
*How worried are you that you might get COVID-19 at work and then infect someone in your family?*



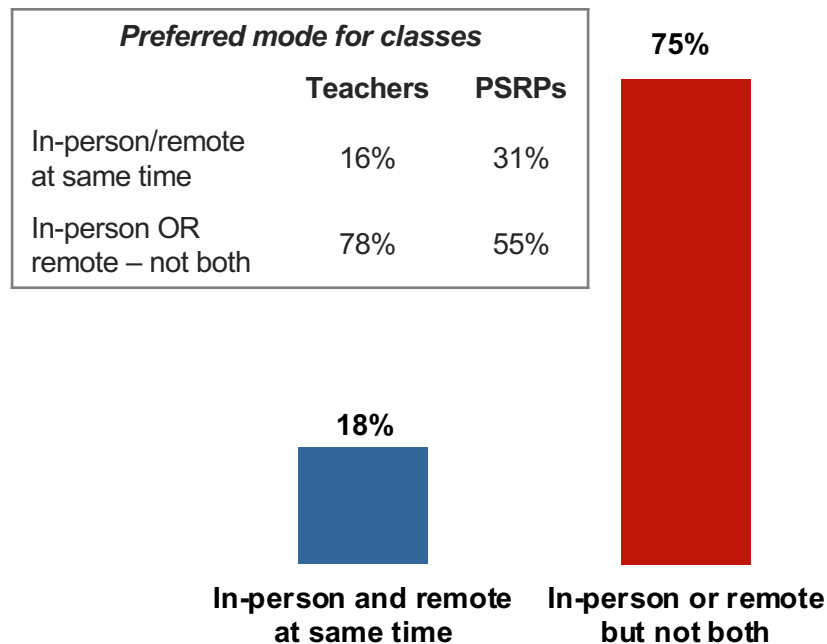
36% are at high-risk for COVID-19, 47% live with someone at high risk.

*In terms of student learning, how well has distance learning worked compared with traditional in-person teaching?*

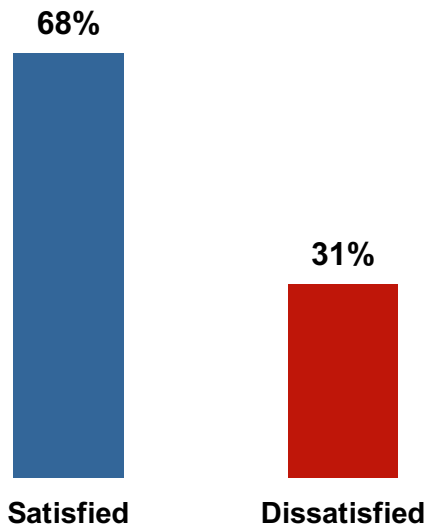


*Preference for conducting class sessions*

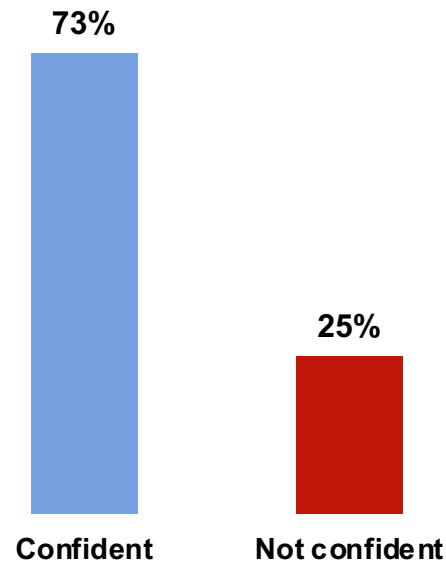


# Most Members Confident in their School System

*Satisfaction with how my school system has handled the COVID-19 pandemic*

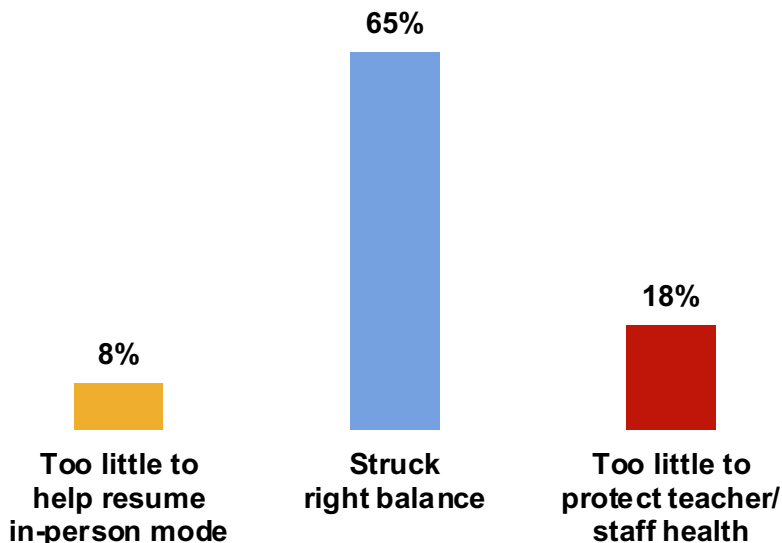
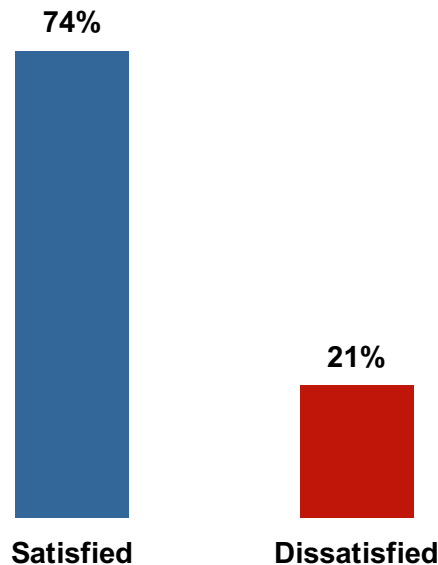


*Confidence that my school will take necessary steps to keep staff safe this spring*

*Satisfaction with how my union has handled the COVID-19 pandemic*

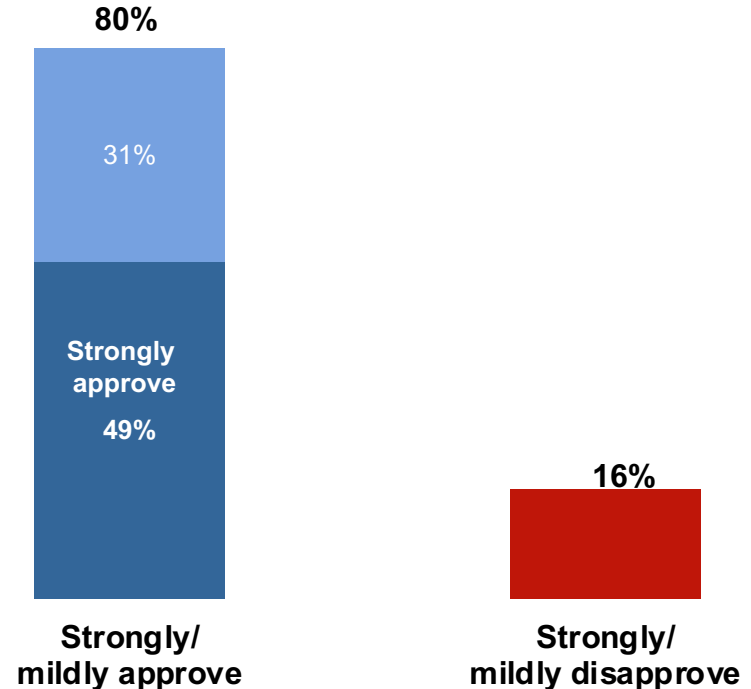




## Strong Support for Biden's Safe Reopening Posture

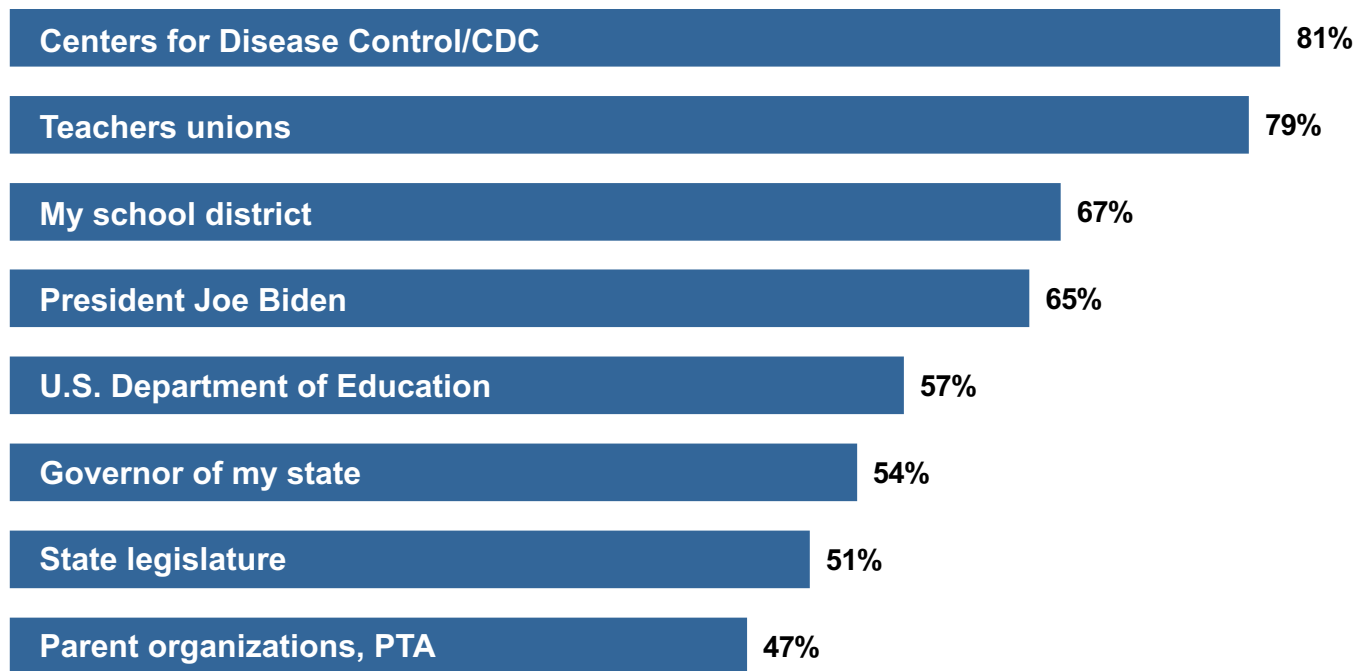

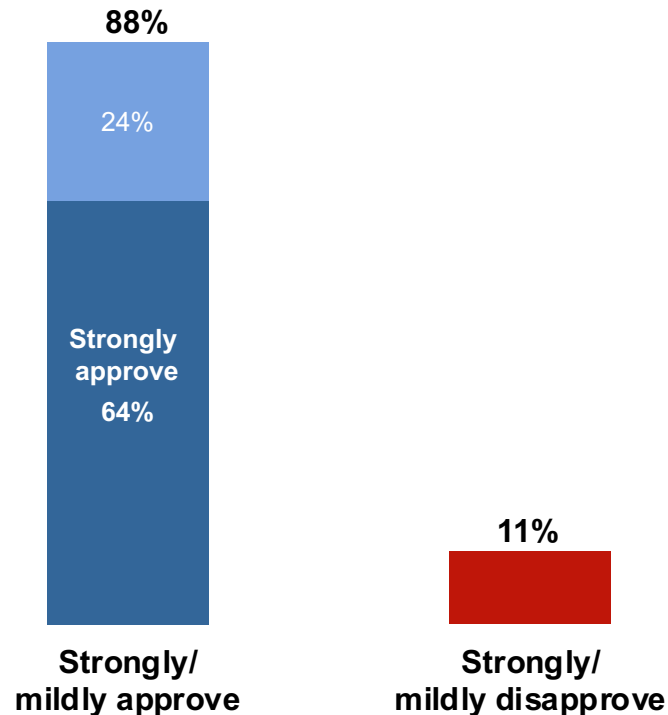

# Overwhelming Support for AFT Safe Reopening Plan

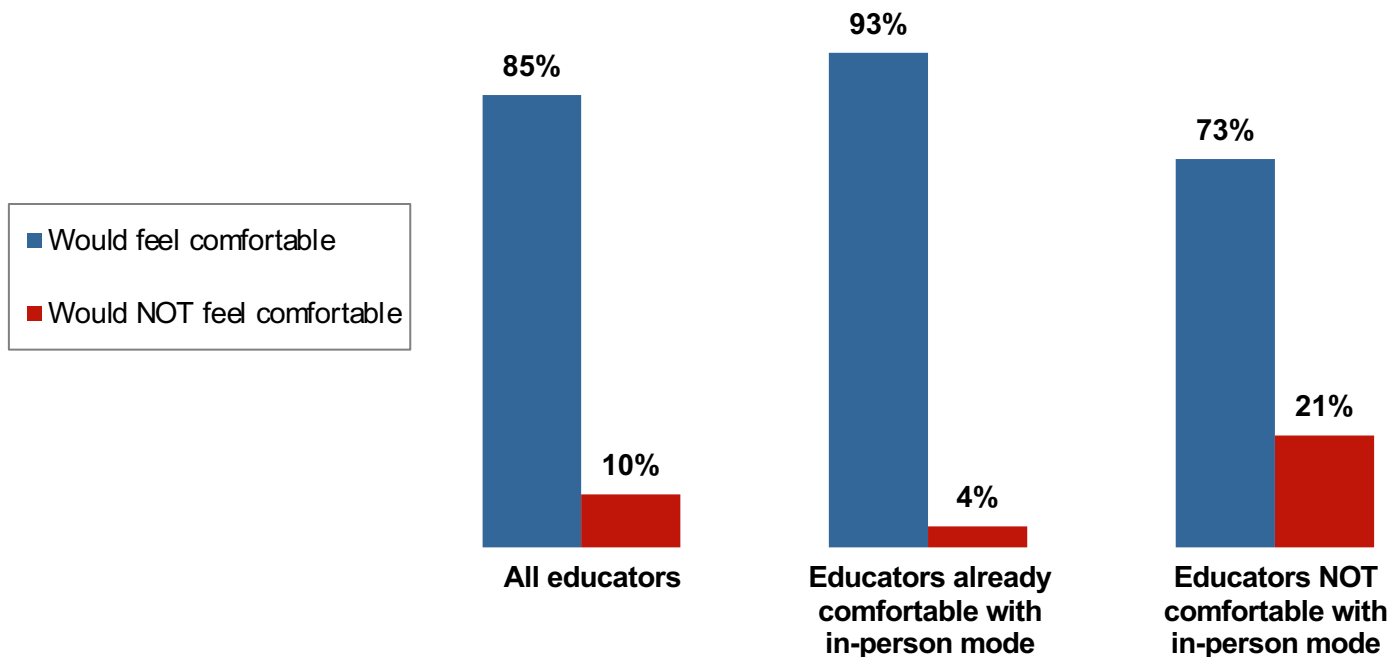
*Proposal by the American Federation of Teachers for safely re-opening schools for in-person instruction:*

*Full in-person learning can happen with the proper testing and safety protocols. COVID-19 testing must become a way of life in schools and we need to test regularly and rapidly to monitor the virus. We need to ensure the proper safety protocols, including masks, physical distancing, cleaning and sanitizing procedures, and ventilation upgrades in every school. High-risk teachers and school staff need appropriate accommodations to keep them safe. And we need to prioritize vaccinations for teachers and school staff.*



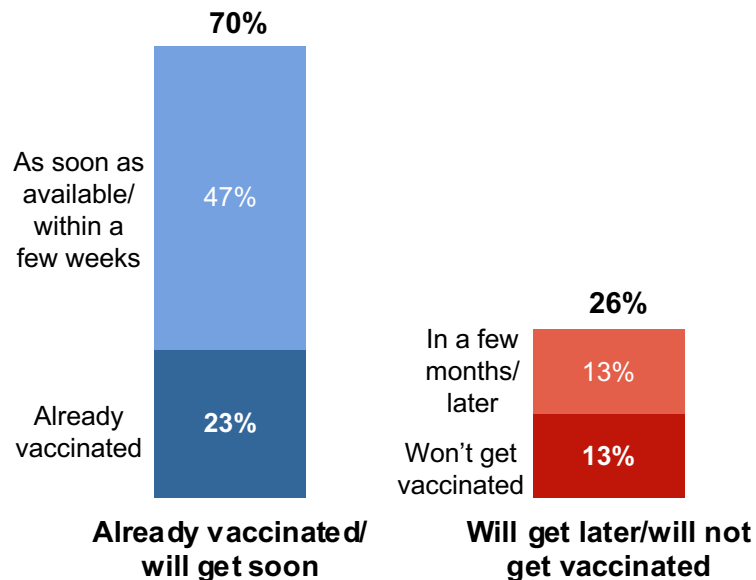
## If AFT Plan Adopted, Members Will Be Comfortable Working in Person

## Most Want to be Vaccinated Soon, But 1 in 4 Do Not

*Two different COVID-19 vaccines have been approved by the Food and Drug Administration as safe and effective, and other COVID-19 vaccines are also likely to be approved. What are your plans for getting the COVID-19 vaccine?*
