COVID-19 Safety

AFT has a responsibility to provide a safe meeting environment free of known hazards. We believe our collective responsibility to each person's health and safety is best served by ensuring that everyone who attends the AFT convention is fully vaccinated against COVID-19. This has been the AFT's practice throughout the pandemic.

The following protocols are required of all attendees at the AFT convention:

- **1. Proof of full vaccination**—Upload your vaccination card via the CLEAR app. Full vaccination means completion of the primary series of Pfizer, Moderna or J&J shots. The AFT encourages attendees to be up to date with all boosters recommended for you.
- 2. Negative antigen test on July 13 or 14— On July 13 or 14, allow 30 minutes upon arrival at the convention center to take a rapid antigen test administered by Impact Health. You will upload your results to the **CLEAR app**.
- 3. Second negative antigen test on July 16—When you register, you will receive an additional test kit to take back to your hotel. On

Saturday, July 16, you will be required to upload a second negative test to the CLEAR app by taking a picture of your test result using this test kit. You must upload a new negative test result on Saturday to get a green result in the CLEAR app.

- **4. Mask requirement**—A mask that covers your nose and mouth must be worn in the convention center unless you are actively eating or drinking.
- 5. Daily health check—Complete the daily health survey via the CLEAR Health Pass. You will be required to show the green status screen on your app each day for admission to the convention center and AFT events.







NewsGuard For AFT members & students



What is NewsGuard?

NewsGuard is media literacy tool provided free to AFT members, their students and their families through a partnership with the AFT. It is appropriate for use with secondary and postsecondary students who access the internet for informationgathering and research.

How does NewsGuard work?

When AFT members register at **www.newsguard tech.com/aft**, they will be sent an email with directions on how to download a NewsGuard browser extension to computers, iPads, tablets and smartphones, together with passwords to make the extension operable. The passwords work for both members and their students. The browser extension provides continuously updated ratings of the trustworthiness of media sources that provide news and information on the internet. These ratings are developed by trained journalists, using nine apolitical criteria.

Since the basis for each individual rating is provided, with explicit references to the nine criteria, the NewsGuard system gives educators an opportunity to teach students how to evaluate the accuracy and reliability of all sources of news and information they encounter. Consequently, NewsGuard is a tool that both fights misinformation and promotes media literacy.

What supports does the AFT provide its members for the dissemination and use of NewsGuard?

The AFT offers professional development resources that will assist members in becoming acquainted with NewsGuard and using it in their classes and with their students.

- Share My Lesson provides model classroom lessons for introducing NewsGuard to students and using it to teach media literacy. go.aft.org/smlnewsguard

How can the AFT help my local in disseminating NewsGuard to members?

NewsGuard will provide workshops (mostly virtual) for AFT members at state federation conferences and conventions and at-large membership meetings of locals. If your state federation or local is interested in arranging for such a workshop, email Leo Casey, assistant to the president, AFT, at **lcasey@aft.org**.

We encourage affiliate leaders and staff to download and try out the browser extension themselves, so they can answer general questions from members about NewsGuard. We discourage affiliate leaders and staff from attempting to resolve members' technical issues in

downloading and accessing the browser extension, which should be directed to NewsGuard itself for resolution. The email sent to the members upon registration provides instructions on how to get technical assistance.
