- Provide resources for rural leaders to advocate for the issues, policies and institutions that allow our communities to thrive, like Medicaid and the Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program, public schools, hospitals, libraries and post offices.
- Encourage rural leaders to engage with the union at the state and national levels, so we can build a movement that is as broad and deep as the communities we serve.

But most importantly, this newsletter exists to help rural members see ourselves in the AFT, and the rural caucus exists to help the AFT continue to see and support rural members in return.
