THINGS TO KNOW BEFORE YOU VOTE: CHECK YOUR VOTER REGISTRATION

It is not enough for you to register to vote. Before Election Day, it is important to check your voter registration status to make sure your name is still on the list at the right address. Even if you registered and voted before, you should check to be sure you are still on the rolls. This is especially true if you haven't voted recently.

Why check your voter registration?

- Because the National Voter Registration Act requires states to make a reasonable effort to remove ineligible voters from the rolls and sometimes they make mistakes.
- The U.S. Supreme Court has ruled that States can start the process of removing a voter from voter rolls if the voter has not voted in recent elections.
- However, the state must first send a notification asking voters to confirm their address. The state can remove voters if they don't respond and then don't vote in the next 2 federal elections

What to do if you have registered but are not showing up on the voter rolls?

- ❖ Call 866-OUR-VOTE
 - The National Voter Registration Act might allow you to update your voter registration information and our trained volunteers can provide you with information about how the law is applied in your state.
